Be Connected content roadmap

Buying and selling online

- A suite of 6 courses focusing on safely buying and selling online.
- We review different payment methods, with focus on PayPal being the safest payment method as it allows people to pay and receive payment without sharing personal payment details with multiple online stores and individuals. PayPal also provides additional protection if something goes wrong with the purchase.
- Covering the major online marketplaces, i.e. eBay, Facebook Marketplace and Gumtree. As the world's largest online marketplace, eBay is used to demonstrate the buying and selling lifecycle, including case studies in the final two courses.
- Those case studies follow a central character, Antonio, as he sells his unwanted household items and then purchases a new artwork on eBay.
- Key focus on safety and how to stay safer while buying and selling online.

Smart homes and Cloud technology

- Courses that explain what Smart homes are and how smart devices in the home can be used to increase quality of life. E.g:
 - listening to radio and watching playback TV online
 - ability to set reminders and alarms
 - control lighting and home security
 - make phone calls from one device to another.
- A course dedicated to Cloud technology, explaining what it is and how it integrates with everyday devices - such as syncing information between smart phones, tablets and laptop/desktop.
- Focus on using these devices safely and what to be aware of in terms of costs associated with Cloud plans.

Online banking using apps

- Courses for banking online using smart devices. Course content focusing on the key tasks developed for the desktop version of Squirrel bank that we recently released. E.g. logging in and out, checking balances, downloading statements and paying a bills.
- First courses will introduce the key concepts via learning text and supporting graphics. Final courses will consist of a practice area to allow learners to practise their new skills in a safe and secure environment.
- The practice area will provide learners with a Squirrel Bank app simulation of real-life banking experiences on a mobile device, e.g. scroll wheel to select figures, tapping on accounts and menu items and using face ID to login.
- Importantly, the text courses will be available for all devices, but the practice area will be optimised specifically for tablet and smartphone .

Researching and booking travel online

- Courses that introduce learners to the concept and benefits of researching and booking travel online, e.g. easy to compare pricing, convenient and cost effective.
- Case studies included in the learning content will focus on local travel destinations within Aust and NZ.
- Content will also focus on travelling safely domestically and overseas, including how to avoid common scams and pitfalls. We'll outline the how learners can register with Smart Traveller, use DFAT for travel advice and renew and apply for visas and passports online.

Continuous improvement

- We will audit all of our current content to identify those areas that needs updating.
- Updates to existing content will happen in the background as new content is being developed.
